

ICCPM Fellows Code of Conduct

The ICCPM Code of Conduct applies to all individuals representing themselves as ICCPM Fellows.

Where a breach of the code of conduct is alleged the matter may be referred to the management or board of ICCPM. The ICCPM Board reserves the right to withdraw endorsement of a Fellow if a breach is confirmed to have occurred.

ICCPM Fellows recognise they have a responsibility to ICCPM and a duty to one another to:

- Act with integrity in all dealings;
- Act in accordance with the laws, rules and regulations applicable in the jurisdictions in which they act;
- Conduct themselves in such a way as to maintain the reputation and standing of ICCPM as a quality, independent and impartial body;
- Act in a professional, collegiate and respectful manner toward other Fellows and members of ICCPM's network;
- Uphold the professional capabilities, reputation and capacity of ICCPM personnel and other Fellows;
- Support ICCPM by actively participating in ICCPM activities and encouraging and promoting the goals of the ICCPM to their profession and the broader community;
- Support ICCPM by undertaking reasonable activities on behalf of the ICCPM;

Cooperate fully with ICCPM including:

- Advising ICCPM of any changes to contact details
- Responding promptly to any requests to provide information
- Promptly report any breaches of this code of conduct to ICCPM Management; and
- Submit themselves to the deliberations of ICCPM management, and do all things necessary to assist those deliberations, in respect to any investigation into a breach or alleged breach of the code of conduct.

In the event that a Fellow is found in breach of the Fellows Code of Conduct, the ICCPM Constitution provides for the removal of Fellows in the following way:

Clause 8.9 The Directors may resolve, by ordinary resolution, to remove a Fellow from ICCPM if:

- a. the Fellow has breached the code of conduct for Fellows; or
- b. if the Fellow is deemed to not be displaying the attributes and character expected of a Fellow
