Below is a list of items we require for publication:

- Article – 800 to 2000 words
- A high-quality profile picture
- Brief bio – word limit 150 words (+/- 10%)
- Any images included in the article to be submitted as separate, high quality .jpg or .png file types

Audience: CONNECT is **not** an academic journal. The ICCPM Member community consists of project professionals, policy makers and academics from different industries, countries and sectors. Articles should focus on insights, lessons learned and the translation of research into practice. Extensive reference lists will not be published.

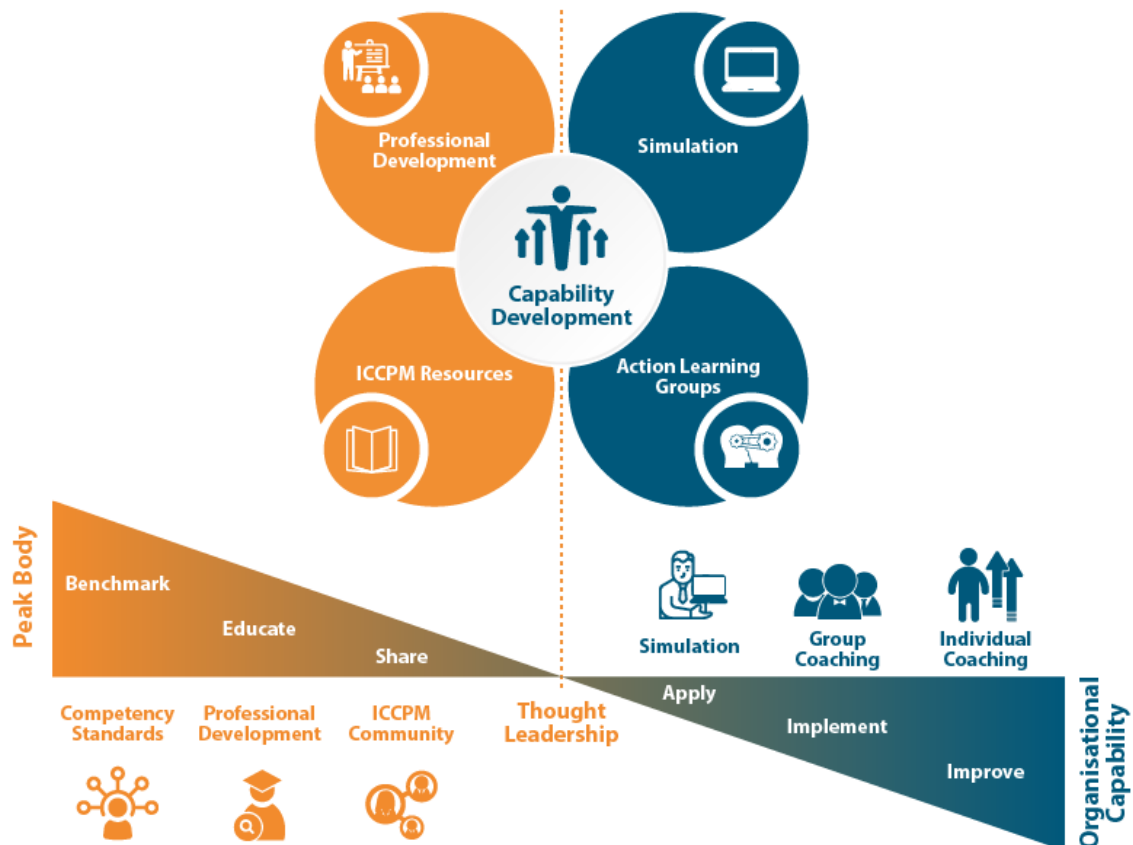
